CHBA BC Association Award Winners Announced

(March. 16, 2015) – Following their Annual General Meeting, the Canadian Home Builders' Association of BC (CHBA BC) presented its Association Awards at its President's Night celebration. The evening honoured the efforts and dedication of those who promote the Association's mission and objectives, including outgoing CHBA BC President, Rob Capar.

In addition, their Executive Officer, Christy MacLeod, was awarded the *Executive Officer of the Year* award for her dedicated service and professionalism in advancing the interests of the CHBA-Fraser Valley local and its members.

Furthermore, for her outstanding service and involvement in the Provincial Association, CHBA BC awarded the *Member of the Year* award to Lynn Harrison, of Harrison Marketing Resources. Ms. Harrison is currently on CHBA BC's Board of Directors, while also serving as Co-Chair for CHBA BC's Marketing Committee, as well as sitting on numerous additional provincial committees.
