As head of the Economics Department, Ali manages and analyzes the content for Zonda, runs special research projects, strategizes with the nation's largest homebuilders, and presents nationwide covering topics across the housing market and wider economy.

Ali is the creator of Zonda's proprietary indices, including the New Home Pending Sales Index and the New Home Lot Supply Index. Ali has focused much of her career on understanding prior recessions and led the charge on 'Millennials discussing Millennials' in the homebuilding space.Highly regarded as an industry expert, Ali is quoted frequently in national publications including CNBC, The Wall Street Journal, Forbes, and Yahoo! Finance, and has also appeared on national and international TV and radio programs such as Bloomberg TV and Marketplace. Further, Ali serves as an advisor to the White House, providing data and insights on the U.S. housing market.

Prior to joining the Zonda team, Ali worked for another consultancy firm and was a researcher for both the Canadian and UK Parliaments. Ali holds a Bachelor's Degree from The Ohio State University in Economics and a Master's Degree from the London School of Economics in Real Estate Economics and Finance.



How building net zero housing helped create affordable homes for Williams Lake First Nation

Bio:

Willie Sellars was born and raised in Williams Lake and is a member of the Williams Lake First Nation of the Secwépemc Nation. Elected to Council at the age of 23 in 2008, Willie was one of the youngest elected councillors in WLFN's history. After serving 10 years on Council, he was elected as the Chief in 2018 and is currently in his second term. Willie worked as a wildland firefighter for the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations before returning to his community to assume the position of special project coordinator in the WLFN Economic Development Department. He was responsible for new business initiatives flowing from impact benefit agreements, engagement with proponents in the Traditional Territory, and community consultation for major projects.

Willie is the author of Dipnetting with Dad, which won a Moonbeam Children's Book Award and was shortlisted for the Chocolate Lily, Shining Willow, and Ontario Library Association awards. His second book is Hockey with Dad. Willie enjoys family time with his partner and five kids, powwow dancing, playing hockey with the Williams Lake Stampeders, attending community events at WLFN, and hunting and dipnet fishing.

Digital Innovation and Prefabrication with Joe Geluch

Virtual Design and Construction (VDC) is a unique and necessary technology that has the capability to benefit BC's residential construction industry in regard to: housing demand, affordability, environmental sustainability, field labour shortages, reduction in waste materials, growth in a technically inclined workforce, off-site assembly & pre-fabrication, new home buyer protection

Modern home construction is a complex manufacturing process involving professionals equipped with a variety of skills and training. In traditional residential home construction, a guiding plan is developed to assemble a product based on two-dimensional drawings, which often lack details concerning changing climate and unique environmental factors. This outdated process leads to a drastically different final product at the cost and risk of the homeowner.

Naikoon Contracting, BC Housing and SCIUS Advisory conducted a case study and research while collaborating with design and construction industry firms to formulate a robust residential building process centered around Virtual Design and Construction. The findings in virtually centered design and construction will specifically address the rapidly changing industry climate in BC, such as trades shortages, improved prefabrication coordination, and the increased uptake of sustainable building practices (Netzero, Step Code 5) while meeting homeowner time and cost requirements.

Joe Geluch of Naikoon will present the case study, tools and execution procedures to execute BIM in single family homes resulting in off-site construction and extremely fast structural assembly.

Bio:

Joe Geluch is the President and CEO of Naikoon Contracting Ltd. A leading high-performance home Construction Manager with a number of innovative Net Zero and Passive House projects completed throughout British Columbia. As President of Naikoon he has led his team to over 50 industry awards, locally, provincially and nationally.

He is a Red Seal Carpenter, a Gold Seal Project Manager, and a Certified Housing Professional who has spent over 22 years in the industry. He is a founding member of Canada's Net Zero Energy Housing Council and served on CHBA BC's Board and Executive Committee, past chair of Technical Research Committee and past chair of BCIT's carpentry advisory committee.

Step Code for Part 9 Buildings in Whistler

Industry members are invited to join us for this informative and interactive session to deepen your understanding of the Step Code for Part 9 Buildings in Whistler, learn from past experiences, and gain practical insights to enhance your building practices.

This session is designed for builders, tradespeople and designers with a basic understanding of the Energy and Carbon Step Codes. Mark Bernhardt will start with a review of key metrics and goals, highlighting how design choices impact success. The session will look back at lessons learned and data from recent years in BC, focusing on trends, common mistakes, and costeffective solutions. We'll cover air leakage testing and the functionality and cost-effectiveness of heat pumps and dual-energy systems in cold climates.

The Resort Municipality of Whistler (RMOW) will also present their approach and requirements for Step Code for Part 9 Buildings in Whistler, and provide practical examples and tips for what works well and doesn't work well for an efficient application and inspection process. The session will include interactive discussions to hear tips and experiences from others in the room about cost-effective approaches to reaching step code levels and will conclude with an opportunity for the audience to ask questions and discuss their biggest unknowns and challenges related to meeting step code performance.

In 2019, he helped create and launch Pink Whitney, which has gone on to become the #1 flavored vodka in North America. He joined Turner Sports in 2021 as a studio analyst for NHL on TNT.

Bob "The Moj" Marjanovich has enjoyed a career in the media for over 25 years.

Starting out as a writer for Sports Vue, The Moj parlayed that into a sports talk career that spanned 20 years and was highlighted by co-hosting Donnie & The Moj with Don Taylor, which aired weekday afternoons on TSN 1040.

During that time, The Moj has covered 23 Super Bowls, over a dozen Grey Cups, Stanley Cup Finals and other sports. It has allowed him to accumulate one of the most extensive contact lists of executives, athletes and celebrities in North America.

He also has been part of the BC Lions radio broadcasts for over 15 seasons as a host, sideline reporter and now as the play-by-play voice of the CFL team. He also writes a bi-weekly column for the Black Press newspaper chain which includes over 70 community newspapers in B.C.

His football career saw him play junior college in Stockton, California, Western Washington University and UBC. The Moj wound up coaching football at UBC for four years as well.
